I'm so excited this morning as I write to you with these updates... I can hardly wait to "open the church" on September 12th. We will come together in one service at 10:30am to worship inside in our sacred space! It's been 18 months since many of you have been in the church for a worship service and I have yet to celebrate a full service in the church so yes! - I'm beaming with joy and counting the days! I would like to encourage each of you to attend as it's going to be an exciting day at Trinity and a great opportunity to bring a friend. Here is what you can expect:

- We will have an Easter like service with a full liturgy, including music (full choir and brass quartet) at 10:30am in the church. 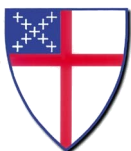

Outreach



Laurie Volk writes...

Despite losing its largest source of funding from the Stable Tour, Trinity continued to provide much needed funds and volunteer commitment during the most difficult times in 2020 and 2021. The necessary funds were secured through generous parish giving and pivoting to the first Joy of Giving Online Christmas Auction that raised \$24,000.

In the face of the pandemic the focus of outreach shifted to primarily essential local needs. Through our outreach ministries Trinity provided support in the form of funding, and limited volunteer engagement to the following ministries:

- Tree of Life Ministry, supplying healthy meals for pick-up in Purcellville
- Mobile Hope, funding for mobile medical services in Loudon County
- FISH, assisting local residents with urgent financial needs
- Churches of Upperville, delivering food baskets to local families at the holidays
- Thrift Shop, now under the Outreach umbrella, providing assistance to local residents with urgent needs including medical bills, prescriptions and rent.



As we emerge from the pandemic, the Outreach Committee is revisiting the needs of other local, national and international causes we hope to support including the Northern Virginia Therapeutic Riding Program in Clifton, Virginia and Tree of Life's

other ministries in Purcellville providing shelter, healthcare and life skills. In the face of recent disasters, the Outreach Committee hopes to provide immediate short-

term funding for Hurricane relief in Louisiana through Episcopalrelief.org and assistance to Haiti following the devastating earthquake.

The Outreach Committee is in need of new leadership and parish involvement. Plans are underway for an Outreach Reboot this fall, to clarify the mission, establish priorities and improve our

methods. What do you think are the most pressing needs in our community and the world? Please get involved and bring your ideas to the next Outreach meeting.

For many of us, outreach is the truest expression of what God calls us to do. Please be a part of the effort.

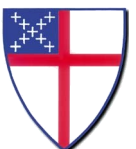

Good day! I'm Richard Jones and I'm excited to have recently joined you as the new Director of Operations and Communications here at Trinity. I'm based at the Parish Office where you can typically find me each weekday.

I'm married to Julie and we have two daughters, Evie (12) and Mia (10). We've very recently moved to Potomac Falls, near Sterling, and before that lived in Richmond.

Julie is from Georgia; Evie and Mia are from the Hawaiian Islands and I'm originally from Wales, United Kingdom; so

we really are an 'international' family!

I've worked in parish and clergy support and development roles for almost twenty years, across three dioceses; two within The Church in Wales and one within the Church of England. I have a passion for the life, work, mission and ministry of the rural church, having most recently worked within the Diocese of Hereford; the most rural diocese within all of England. Here I supported 409 churches across 1800 square miles, with a total resident population of just 325,000 people. Herefordshire is perhaps most famous for its cattle (Herefords), for hop growing (which supports many cider and beer producers) and for its amazing natural beauty and scenery..

When I'm not busy at work I'm a keen amateur photographer, genealogist (I've traced family history back to around the year 1400), a church bell-ringer (English style ringing), and a local historian (two books published). I enjoy cooking, reading, I'm a seasoned traveler., and as a proud Welshman I (of course!) enjoy singing. I am passionate about all things "Welsh" especially the early Celtic church and the lives and teaching of the early Welsh saints.

It's going to be a busy and exciting fall at Trinity and I'm looking forward to being part of it! If I haven't met you already, then do stop me and say "hi" and introduce yourself; I look forward to meeting all the Trinity family and to sharing with you in what God has in store for us. I'll be at our Ministry Fair on 12 September so hopefully we'll meet up there.

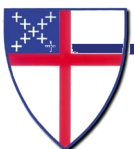
So what about the title "Helo. Mae'n dda bod yma"? Well it's Welsh for "Hello. It's good to be here". And it sure is!

Music to our ears

Mission Statement

It is our mission to enable and to encourage all members of the parish to share in the experience of glorifying God through music; to teach together the skills of music and the practices of faith; and to build the body of Christ through worship, rehearsal, outreach, and fellowship using music as an instrument of God's peace.

Trinity's music program is committed to people of all ages and experience coming together in a nurturing, supportive environment to practice the skills of music and the ways of faith. We will continue to build on our long tradition of great music with hopes of further perfecting our praises and nurturing each other.

Trinity Church's inspiring architecture and excellent acoustics draw even the most hesitant worshipers into participating in liturgy and song. The acoustics also enhance the sound of our 3 manual, 55 rank Aeolian-Skinner pipe organ, which is ideal for accompanying worship in a wide variety of sacred music styles.

Children's Choirs

Prior to the Covid-19 pandemic, Trinity has offered several children's choirs to varying age groups. The Junior Choir (age 4 years through 2nd grade), and the Chorister's (grades 3-8) learned the basics of singing and developing their vocal sound as well as skills in music reading. As we continue to rebuild, we encourage all interested children to



indicate their interest by signing up and we will determine how best to structure the program to meet the needs of our youngest parishioners.

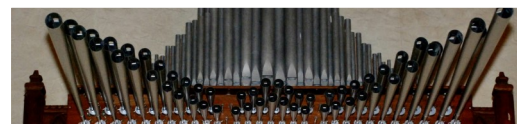
Handbell Choir

The adult handbell choir plays a variety of traditional handbell music, as well as accompaniments to choral anthems and congregational singing, on our 4-octave set of Schulmerich Handbells. Music reading ability is helpful but not essential. The handbell choir participates in worship approximately once per month.

Chancel Choir

The Chancel Choir, the focal point of our music ministry, sings at the 10:30 am service from September through Trinity Sunday, as well as at other major liturgical occasions. Adults of high school age and above are welcome to join. Group vocal development, musical interpretation, worship practice and spiritual growth are all emphasized. The Choir's repertoire is diverse and includes choral works of all periods, from the 16th century to the present day, sung to a high standard.

Rehearsals are held on Thursday evenings



from 7:00-9:00 pm, and Sunday mornings at 9:45. All are welcome. Some musical experience is helpful, but not required.

In addition to the Director of Music Ministries and Organist, the music staff consists of a Church Music Intern/Assistant Choirmaster, and 5 choral section leaders.

Money Matters

Gina Hammond, Treasurer writes:



2021, like 2020, has been an interesting year when it comes to church finances.

We finished 2020 with a Net Income of \$135,930. The surplus came primarily from receipt of forgiveness on our Payroll Protection Program (PPP) Loan of \$98,100. We made the decision to move Outreach to a separate budget which we funded at \$47,426. By Vestry resolution, the Campus Renewal fund received \$22,134 and the Organ Maintenance Fund received \$3,430. This left a net surplus of \$62,348.

Our Stewardship drive for 2021 resulted in receiving pledges totaling \$566,834 from 134 pledging units. This included 24 pledges from new people and 113 pledges from existing parishioners. We lost 8 pledging units due to moves and deaths totaling \$45,345. Compared to 2020 we received seven fewer pledges resulting in a net decrease of \$331 in pledge income.

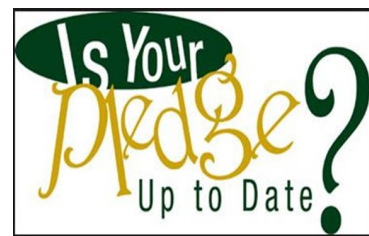
The 2021 church budget was developed with the hope that activities would return to normal more quickly than they have. We projected our 2021 income to be \$880,126. This figure did not include the net surplus noted above.

This surplus was left on our balance sheet under retained earnings. Our expenses for 2021 were projected at \$1,025,748 resulting in our 2021 net income being projected at a deficit of \$145,621. The Vestry approved this deficit because our retained earnings at the start of 2021 were \$156,918. We also secured another PPP loan for \$98,100.

The Vestry has been diligent in managing our expenses throughout the year. Now that we are two-thirds of the way through 2021, our total income from various sources (pledge payments, plate offerings, special offering, wedding and funeral income, endowment draw, flowers, and rental and utility income) has been \$553,259 or 62.9% of the expected income. Our expenses have been \$546,673 or 53.3% of the expected expenses.

We thank the 102 pledging units who have remained current or prepaid their pledges. We are still expecting to receive \$150,401 in current pledge dollars for the remainder of the year as well as \$75,000 in prepayments for 2022.

We know our expenses will also increase as we move into resuming our program year. Our staffing levels have now returned to 2020 levels with the arrival of our new Director of Operations and Communications, Richard Jones.
