From The Interim Rector

One of the great features of the church calendar is the emphasis on seasons which complement key days. The season of Lent builds toward Easter just as the season of Advent leads to Christmas. The seasons were developed less to serve the needs of the church and more to serve the needs of the people. For this reason, Lent is not so much a means of maintaining discipline among church members by insisting on "prayer, fasting, and self-denial," in the words of the Book of Common Prayer. On the contrary, Lent is a seasonal chance for people, through "prayer, fasting, and self-denial," to gather ourselves together both in community and individually. The purpose is to collect ourselves that we might find the center of life. We engage in activities that help us reflect on the daily responsibilities that consume our time, energy, and resources. The Gospel passages from Luke help. Each Sunday Jesus engages the people he encounters in refining how they live and what truly matters.

Among what matters at Trinity Church is the role children play in our congregation. Thanks to volunteers, we are able to offer Sunday school for ten Sundays beginning with the First Sunday in Lent, March 10. The program, from 9:30-10:15 will be in three groupings: Nursery, Pre-K through 2nd grade, and 3rd through 5th grades. More specific details will be available weekly in the eGenesis. In the meantime, I hope you will encourage any children in your families or among friends to come.

Finally, the process for seeking a new Rector matters. With the Discernment Committee now formed, we commission them this Sunday with prayers for them and for the parish at both services. The Committee is task oriented, but its success will ultimately base its grounding in prayer. Please join us this Sunday as our prayers for this process begins.

I look forward to Lent with you.

Ash Wednesday



Wednesday, March 6, 2019 marks the beginning of Lent, a season of reflection and introspection in preparation for Holy Week and Easter.

Lent begins with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. On Ash Wednesday we will have 2 services, one at noon and one at 7:00 PM. We encourage everyone to participate.

The services will include both the Holy Eucharist and the imposition of ashes. During the imposition of ashes, the interim rector will take ashes (from the burning of the previous year's Palm Sunday palms) and will make the mark of the cross on each congregant's forehead. The imposition of ashes is a reminder of our mortality, and our total reliance on God.

Clara Gerdes in Recital

Musicians and the general public alike have a special opportunity on March 22 at Trinity Episcopal Church in Upperville to hear an outstanding performer on an outstanding pipe organ. **CLARA GERDES**, the award-winning organist, will play works by Reubke, Hakim. Dupre and others. The program is designed to feature the talent of this exceptionally gifted virtuoso and to feature Trinity Church's recent tonal revision and regulation of the Aeolian-Skinner pipe organ.

Ms. Gerdes has already won many important competitions and is in her fifth year of studies at the Curtis Institute in Philadelphia while maintaining a demanding concert schedule. Among her accolades are her first-place award at the Albert Schweitzer Competition and winner of the Mid-Atlantic Regional of the 2017 AGO Quimby Competition. She has also performed full concert programs at the Washington National Cathedral and the recent National AGO Convention 2018 in Kansas City.

The instrument is a three-manual, 55 rank Aeolian-Skinner pipe organ installed in 1960 under the supervision of Roy Parry, who was also responsible for the instrument at the National Cathedral. Additional ranks were added in 1996 by Lawless-Johnson Organ Co., and during 2017-19 a complete tonal re-voicing and regulation was performed by the team of Lawrence Trupiano (NYC) and Bard Wickkiser (Baltimore). The organ consists of approximately 3,300 pipes and consists of five divisions: Great, Swell, Choir, Pedal, and Antiphonal. The latter division is located on the back wall of the Nave and features the Trompette-en-chamade (horizontal trumpet), a signature stop of the Aeolian-Skinner organs from that era.

The church building was a gift from the Mellon family and was constructed between 1951 and 1960. The church complex is built in the style of a French country church of the 12th and 13th centuries. The construction of the church was executed entirely by local craftsmen, using carved sandstone quarried near Warrenton, VA with detailed workmanship from local limestone.

We don't need them until April 7th but they can be made ahead of time and frozen.

Cookie Ministry Cookies for Prisoners

Please make each cookie with prayer. These cookies help open hearts to repentance and forgiveness and an awareness of God's vast love.

Bake any recipe you would like, but please keep in mind that if we are to take each and every cookie into the institution, we need to follow certain guidelines.

This means that specific ingredients cannot be used. When baking, please remember:

- NO raisins or other dried fruit or coconut
- NO toppings such as sugar, decorations or icing
- **NO** candy such as M&Ms
- NO nuts
- **YES** to chocolate and butterscotch chips
- COOL COOKIES completely before placing them in I quart zip lock bags

Cookies should be approximately 2 to 2 1/2 inches in size.

12 cookies per quart size zip lock bag



Please indicate the type of cookie on each bag

We need 100 dozen cookies so feel free to start baking now and put them in your freezer.




